

Workshop (symposium) on advance methods – 2008
To be held as part of the 2008 Congress of Social Sciences and Humanities

It is recognised in society that individuals live and function within numerous formal and informal structures. It is also the case that the impact and relevance of the structures varies depending on the research question being addressed. Social scientists in all disciplines are faced with increasingly complex research questions dealing with these types of questions. The Canadian social science community is increasingly gaining access to data and to analytical methods that allows it to address some of these questions.

The goal of this workshop is to provide sufficient information on hierarchical linear modeling (HLM) to permit researchers to begin to use this valuable and important technique. The workshop will be led by Dr. Doug Baer, a recognised expert in advanced quantitative methods in Canada and internationally. It will be organised in two parts – a lecture in the morning and an optional hands-on session in a lab in the afternoon. Handouts will be made available to registered participants. The cost for the whole day is \$75 (\$50 for students and emeriti). The cost for people interested in attending only the lecture is \$50 (\$30 for students and emeriti).
